

Can you believe the new Plymouth police car? With a hand--lettered signs on both front doors - signs with no plastic, no vinyl, and at a cost of \$7? No trim, just white letters!

This period of time was soon after World War II, as things were slowly getting back to normal. You could buy a tank of gasoline for less than forty cents per gallon. In fact, this new police car was only about \$2,000!

So you can see that "things" had begun to enjoy peace again - coffee was less than a dollar per pound, a can of beans was something like two for 25¢, a meal at Edna's Tea Room was only about one dollar.

In 1961 the Wadesboro City Hall was moved from Martin Street, where it had been next door to Rufus Meachum Furniture and Leavitt Funeral Home, to where, for many years, had been the bus station. Many changes have come about these many years, even the business places all over town.

And...about the "new police car" above...as this was the time soon after the close of World War II, I had the pleasure of lettering that car with the orders, "Nothing fancy, not even trim (shadow)." I can understand the request because the car sure was not "loaded with extras." Nowadays the vinyl decorations on the new cars cost more than "the whole Plymouth!" Anyway, "that's the way it was."

SERCAP Provides Individual Household Well Loans to Those Eligible

The Southeast Rural Community Assistance Project (SERCAP) is a non-profit located in Roanoke, VA. They help low to moderate income families get assistance with water. Eligible individual are individuals who are a member of a household in which all members have a combined income (for the most recent 12 month period for which the information is available) that is not more than 100% of the median non-metropolitan household income for the state or territory in which the individual lives.

Expansion of System will be \$150.00

Pool Permit will be \$75.00

Well Permit will be \$250.00

In North Carolina that household income is 57,800. In South Carolina it is 55,800. Here are highlights of the program:

- Loans available for purchase of new water well or repairs to an existing well
- Up to \$11,000
- 1% interest rate
- Terms from 5 to 10 years
- Upfront cost (send with application): Credit Report \$25

• Loan recipient must own and occupy the home or be occupying the home as the purchaser under a legally enforced land purchase contract which is not under default by the seller or the purchaser.

- The home must be located in a rural area.
- The water well system may not be used to substitute water service available from collective water systems.
- The water well system may not be associated with the construction of a new dwelling.
- Loan recipient must not be suspended or debarred from participation in Federal programs.
