Come Visit With Bishop Asbury on January 18 at First United Methodist Church, Wadesboro

This coming Sunday, January 18 First United Methodist Church in Wadesboro will celebrate and remember a very special day in the history of the church and community. Bishop Francis Asbury, the first American Methodist Bishop, preached under the courthouse arches on Sunday, January 18, 1801. This was his last visit to Anson County ... until this Sunday.

January 18, 2015, marks the 214th anniversary - to the day - that Bishop Asbury preached in Wadesboro. The church will mark this important date with Sunday services at 10:55 a.m., featuring music of the period and other elements of the service that early Methodists would have been very familiar with. The newly-created Heritage Room at the church will also be open, with various displays of Methodist related items, including a collection of hymnals dating back to 1797. Following the service there will be a light catered lunch that will be open to all without cost in the fellowship hall.

First UMC was founded in 1790 and this is part of the year-long celebration of the church's 225th anniversary in 2015. We hope that you will be able to join us for this significant day of remembrance in the history of First United Methodist Church and Anson County.

From the delta-inflected gospel sound Mavis Staples helped create in the 1950s (Uncloudy Day), to the engaged protest of the civil rights era (Freedom Highway), and then, amazingly, on pop radio in the 1970s with a series of chart hits (I'll Take You There, Respect Yourself, Lets Do It Again) - Mavis Staples is a soul/gospel legend, Rock and Roll Hall of Famer, and civil rights icon. She will appear at Wingate University's Batte Center on January 30 at 8 p.m.

On her newest CD, legendary singer Mavis Staples and Wilco leader Jeff Tweedy have crafted a gospel album for the 21st century, a music that strives for faith in a world where nothing can be taken for granted. On One True Vine Mavis Staples gives voice to something new in her repertoire, something deeper and more resonant with our times; longtime fans will notice a new reserve in her singing, a muted, plaintive quality that serves the darker, more nuanced songs collected here perfectly.

For six decades Mavis Staples has been the solid rock of American music. Alongside the family group she is so identified with, the Staple Singers, Mavis has managed to transform herself as she goes, yet never alter. Rolling Stone listed her as one of the 100 Greatest Singers of All Time.
