"A safety award shows employees and the community that you are committed to a safe work environment," state Labor Commissioner Berry said. "A good safety record is something to be proud of, and businesses deserve to be recognized for their efforts.

Businesses that qualify for the award must meet two requirements. They must be free of fatalities at the site for which they are applying. The site's injury and illness rate also must be at least 50 percent below that of their industry's average rate.

Award recipients will be honored in their communities throughout the state at safety awards banquets co-sponsored by the N.C. Department of Labor and local chambers of commerce and other organizations.

Award nominations may be submitted by anyone and must include a completed nomination form, cover letter, and the nominee's biography or resume. Letters of support and examples of the nominee's work will also be accepted. Applications may be submitted online at ncdcr.gov/ncawards/nominations or materials may be sent to the North Carolina Awards Committee, N.C. Department of Natural and Cultural Re-

sources, 4601 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, N.C. 27699-4601. "This is the opportunity for us to pay tribute to the North Carolinians who better our experiences by their extraordinary involvement in this state," says Susan Kluttz, Sec-


retary of the N. C. Department of Natural and Cultural Resources. "Please nominate a co-worker, community leader or friend who has served

The North Carolina Awards Committee will review the nominations and make its selections in early summer. The recipients will be honored during ceremonies in Raleigh in September. Past award recipients have included some of the country's most distinguished artists, poets, writers, performers, journalists, scientists and public servants; including William Friday, Romare Bearden, James Taylor, Gertrude Elion, John Hope Franklin, David Brinkley, Maya Angelou, Billy Graham and Branford Marsalis.

Award recipients in 2016 were Anthony S. Abbott of Davidson for Literature; Dr. Anthony Atala, of Winston-Salem for Science; Senator James T. Broyhill of Winston-Salem for Public Service; Dr. A. Everette James, Jr., of Chapel Hill for Fine Arts; Howard N. Lee of Chapel Hill for Public Service; and Patricia McBride of Charlotte for Fine Arts.
