
Grace Trip to **Orlando in March**

Kilwinning Lodge #64 AF&AM

Kilwinning Masonic Lodge of Kilwinning Lodge. was originally chartered in 1813 at a period of time when sometimes reporting to the Grand Lodge was very slow. Then in 1851 the charter was updated, and is still active today. According to some of the old records there were eighteen members in 1813, and there were twenty one members in 1818. Today the total membership is approximately one hundred and fifty.

The "Masonic Hall" was built circa 1850, and after the ninety nine year property lease ran out it was moved in 1951 to its present location on South Greene Street - one block "down the hill" onto a lot given by Mrs. Elizabeth Ingram Little in memory of her father John Billingsley Ingram and her husband Frank Milton Little, both of whom were departed members

After much work and changes it is a very unique structure of interest to many. The sills and much of the original framework are hand hewn and "pegged" together. The original floors are "full-inch heart pine" and some of the walls (original) are plaster on hand-cut lathe that varies in thickness from about an inch to some strips as much as an inch and a half. Of course the original doors and other items are all handmade. The old kerosene lamps have been replaced with electric fixtures to resemble the originals, and restrooms and a kitchen have been added - always with an effort to keep as much of the "original" as possible.

The above sign I designed, built and installed in 1998 - and despite what Chesley and Pete say, I did not take part in the original 1813 charter night!! Ed

Wildlife Commission Offers **Free Turkey Hunting Seminars Statewide**

The N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission and the National Wild Turkey Federation are offering 17 free turkey hunting seminars across North Carolina in March and April in anticipation of the upcoming spring turkey season.

The statewide season for male or bearded turkey is April 11 through May 9, with a youth-only week from April 4-10. Regulations and restrictions on turkey hunting, including information on youth season, are available in the 2014-15 Inland Fishing, Hunting and Trapping Regulations Digest.

"Prior to 2015, the Wildlife Commission has held turkey hunting seminars only in Raleigh," said Walter "Deet" James, the Commission's hunting heritage biologist. "Because they were such a huge success and filled up almost immediately, we wanted to offer them in other parts of the state to bring awareness of conservation and wildlifeassociated recreation to a greater proportion of North Carolinians.
