Wadesboro Trash Pickup Details

The Town of Wadesboro reduced curbside trash pickup service to once-per-week beginning June 30. Customers now have two options. • First, customers can place out bagged trash in up to 4 containers totaling 128 gallons.

• Alternatively, customers can place out up to 4 trash bags without any container.

Under both options, up to 10 pieces of empty cardboard outside any container or bags will be picked up. Non-residential furniture pick-up is limited to 2 items per week. The trash fee will remain unchanged at \$15 per month. All other sanitation services remain unchanged.

Trash Collection Rules

General

Monthly Rate: \$15
Required Container(s): Customer may either: 1) Use up to 4 containers totaling 128 gallons. All trash must be in a bag designed to be a trash receptacle and placed in an eligible container for service, or 2) Place up to four bags designed to be a trash receptacle without any container.

• Trash Day: Monday or Wednesday. Trash must be at curb by 7 a.m. on designated trash pickup day. Customer may put out up to 10 pieces of empty cardboard outside container. Non-residential furniture pick-up is limited to 2 items per week.

Uptown • Monthly Rate: \$15

• Location: Uptown is Rutherford to Morgan to Washington to Martin.

• Required Container(s): Customer may either: 1) Use up to 6 containers totaling 192 gallons. All trash must be in a bag designed to be a trash receptacle and placed in an eligible container for service, or 2) Place up to six bags designed to be a trash receptacle without any container.

• Trash Day: Monday, Wednesday, Friday. Trash must be at curb by 7 a.m. on designated trash pickup day. Customer may put out up to 10 pieces of empty cardboard outside container. Non-residential furniture pick-up is limited to 2 items per week.

Notice of Public Comment period and Public Hearing on Draft Permit Number 0403-MSWLF-2010, to increase the rate of waste disposal at the Chambers Development of North Carolina, Inc., a municipal solid waste landfill facility (MSWLF), pursuant to 15A NCAC 13B .1603 of the Solid Waste Management Rules, from 1500 tons per day to 3000 tons per day is hereby given. The facility is located at 375 Dozer Drive, north of US Hwy. 74 and east of Polkton in Anson County and includes a total area of approximately 875.7 acres. The "Solid Waste Disposal Franchise Ordinance" for this landfill action was approved by Anson County Board of Commissioners on January 9, 2012.

In accordance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules, specifically Rule 15A NCAC 13B .1603(a) (4)(B), a proposed substantial change in the tonnage rate for an existing municipal solid waste landfill (MSWLF) requires a new facility permit. This draft permit reflects the request by Chambers Development of North Carolina, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Waste Connections, Inc., that the current approved tonnage rate of 1500 tons per day be increased to 3000 tons per day. This draft permit does not authorize the construction of additional landfill disposal capacity, change the service area, total volume, or characteristics of waste stream established in the previous permit.

North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules require that the public be given a 45-day period to comment on this draft permit. The comment period will begin Feb. 11 and end at 4:00 p.m. on April 1, 2015. Interested parties may submit written statements and data concerning the proposed changes to the facility permit and conditions to the division at the following address:

A public hearing has also been scheduled for February 23, 2015 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. and will be held at South Piedmont Community College, Lockhart Taylor Center, Studio B, 514 N. Washington St., Wadesboro, N.C. Interested parties may submit oral or written statements and data concerning the proposed changes to the facility permit. Persons wishing to speak may register at the hearing. Comments will be limited to five minutes. A fact sheet and copies of the draft permit may be obtained from the division contact. Persons wishing notification of a final permit decision may register with the contact.
