# FATS, OILS, AND GREASE (FOGS) EDUCATIONAL INFORMATION

In an effort to reduce the potential for Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO), the Public Works staff of the Town of Polkton has compiled the following information to help educate our water and sewer customers concerning the best management practices for the disposal of household Fats, Oils, and Greases (FOGs).

#### How to dispose of Fat, Oil & Grease

1) Allow to cool 2) Use a container with a lid.

3) Pour the cooled grease or oil into a container 4) Place lid on container 5) Scrape or wipe cookware using paper towels or spatula into the garbage before washing.
