

First Methodist Church

Wadesboro's First Methodist Church was organized in 1790, later meeting under "the arches" of the old court house until the deed for property (1832) and the wood church was completed on a lot that was, until recent years, Crawford Motor Company's car lot on Salisbury Street. This church building was replaced in 1891 with a brick church with elevated sanctuary floors, stained glass windows, curved rows of pews, and many other features – built on the corner of South Greene and East Morgan Streets.

Pictured above is that church in the early 1950's – and no, the Esso sign was not part of the church property, but was on the opposite corner service station lot which was adjacent to the Blalock Motor Sales Company.

However, the sign in front of the tall shrubbery had, at one time, been the church sign with

changeable message space, glass covered, too. My job was to "fix it"

- so I covered the entire frame with a new metal panel - hand lettered "First Methodist Church" times for services, "Welcome" and the Pastor's name. This sign served well until the building program for the new (current) sanctuary was completed.

Some interesting facts: This church was at one time part of the South Carolina Annual Conference, which encompassed part of Mecklenburg County and Virginia. There were not any places here large enough for the conference except the newly built Kilwinning Lodge building, which was on the corner then of West Martin and South Greene Streets. The Conference did meet at the Lodge. Old records of the Methodist Church and the Masonic Lodge refer to same!
