Bowman's Restaurant

This one goes back a few Bowman's Restaurant was years. located on Old 74 east of Wadesboro - not as the highway is today, but back then 74 came into town past the present Post Office, then on to Lee Avenue, down the hill, and continued on Highway 74. In later years the present Highways 74 and 52 combined, moving to their present location - with many more changes and improvements added.

Mr. Bowman opened a 24hour restaurant and gas station in the mid 1920's - and for many years it was the only restaurant open day and night from Charlotte to Wilmington. Years moved on - Mr. Bowman had gotten older and slowed down some -Howard Teal had finished high school, and he came to work for Mr. Bowman. There Howard spent the rest of his life (1916-1991) serving good food, gas, great conversation, some politics - the "spot to be in Anson County."

"We doze - but never close" and "Drift to Bowmans."

Through the years there were several additions to the original station - an enlarged kitchen and dining space on the east side. The signs in the picture were on the new dining addition with Howard. I did them in May of 1958 for the sum of \$20 each - 3x3 feet. Later, the Confederate Dining Rooms were added to the west side.

No politician would <u>never ever</u> miss stopping at Bowman's, not only to "get Howard's ideas," but to see what was going on! Some of the folks like Clarence Beck, Lester Dawkins, James Hanna, Walter Mull, Addison Moore, Sr., Richard Perkins, Sophie Kinlaw and Nanie Moore were just a few that I remember, along with the many "occasions" at Bowman's. After Lucy and I got married on Sunday night, September 20, 1942, we went to Bowman's for a "big orange" (only 5¢) - with curb service, delivered right to the car. Other occasions some years later - after the Easter sunrise services at First Methodist Church and others from their churches would meet at Bowman's for breakfast complete with eggs, grits, toast, jelly and coffee - all for less than a dollar!! No, there were no Hardees, McDonalds, Wendys, Burger King none of those, and the City Cafe was not open on Sundays. The Tea Room had not come along, and the National

These are just a few "remembrances" - there are many, many more! Now memories are all that's left of Bowman's. The property was recently sold, the lot cleared ready for a new generation! Will the "new use" make an impression as widespread as Bowman's 24 Hour Restaurant - a place remembered by "travelers" through Wadesboro, a conversation place, a place where many people were hungry, had no money, but were fed - a place of "memories dedicated" to Howard and all of the good folks who "Bowman's Restaurant" connected through the years!

Hotel probably had already closed too!
