

remember the alley that was on the south side of the H.W. Little & Company hardware store. It was for many years used by mules and wagons to go to the back entrance of H. W. Little's to unload a bale of cotton or whatever, and then load items bought from the store - then they came back through the alley onto Greene Street to head home!

This space was an ideal place to build the building pictured above - A. C. Allen Jewelry needed a smaller building near the square of town.

This unique store front was designed and built by Herman Marsh using stainless steel -"formed to his own design." hand-made the metal letters and installed same on December 11, 1959. You will note also that in the above picture that Wadesboro had parking meters - they have long since "bit the dust!"

Can you believe that from the B. C. Moore & Son corner block going south were several dry

I doubt that many of you goods stores and dress shops? There were several offices upstairs - one of which was Dr. Joel Mauldin. In 1959 he opened his dental practice where I lettered his office doors. Outgrowing his space, he later moved his practice to the Smith Building. (Presently Punky Morton's office.) The Mauldins, after about eight years, returned to Albemarle to be near and care for his aging parents continuing his practice there.

> There are so many changes - all around - remember the A&P Lacy's building Grocery? originally was built for the A&P this being the third store location in Wadesboro! (The Anson Social Services building was the final location before A&P closed for good.) Oh yes, Johnny Livingston is "serving New York Life - not Shell gasoline." (For years that building was a service station.)

> These are certainly not all the changes on this side of one block, there are many stories, many happenings - so much to remember!!
