## Forestry Cost-Share Program Overview

Coming up this Thursday, March 21 at the Anson Extension office, from 7 to 9 p.m., is the final class in a series of five Woodland Stewards programs for private forest landowners. This Thursday we will meet members of the Anson County Forest Service and Anson's Agriculture Cost Share Program.

Woodland management goals are specific to each landowner. One family's primary objective may be to build a financial buffer to retirement, enhance wildlife hunting opportunities, raise commercial timber, convert cropland to trees for non-farming descendants, or so on. But it takes deliberate management to raise a healthy and productive stand that will meet those goals over time. Whether you have recently inherited, bought woodland, or just want to learn more, the next step is to find out how local forestry agencies, consultants, and other local resource professionals can help you identify practices to maximize your land's potential. This is a great opportunity to learn which forestry program is the right fit for your farm and who to contact.


