

## Wadesboro Primary School's Drive to Revive Arbor Day

Arbor Day was celebrated on Friday, March 20, more than 80 fourth graders in Wadesboro will roll up their sleeves and plant a tree. The kids will become members of the Fourth Grade Foresters. The project's goal is to help revitalize a remarkable idea-observation of Arbor Day in American schools. Fourth graders at the Wadesboro Primary School and the Peachland-Polkton Elementary School will receive trees to take home and plant.

Jim Chandler, President of the Wadesboro Lions Club who sponsored the trees, said, "This project was made possible because of community support from the citizens of Wadesboro and Anson County, so there is no cost to the students, teachers, the school, or the taxpayer."

Debra Ersch, cofounder of the Fourth Graders Foresters Project stated, "It's a wonderful way to show support to the community, education and the environment." Fourth Grade Foresters USA was created to provide a simple and inexpensive way for any individual, business or organization to send the fourth grade students at an elementary school home with a tree of their own to plant and care for. Each fourth grader receives an individual packaged 12"-18" evergreen tree seedling packaged by workers with disabilities. Students who are unable to plant the seedling at their home will be allowed to plant it at the school.

Now tree planning is even more important than ever. Trees take carbon dioxide (CO2) out of the atmosphere and clean the air we breathe. Planting trees is a simple, inexpensive and easy way to improve the community.

"I would like to thank President McGee for his years of visionary leadership to my alma mater. He has left a profound legacy, and I look forward to building on his great work."

Brown has 26 years of experience in higher education. At Wingate, he's served in numerous roles before being named in 2009 to his current position overseeing admissions, student life and marketing.

"Dr. Brown has been a highly respected member of Wingate University's senior leadership team for many years," said Dr. McGee. "I am confident the University will enjoy continued success during his tenure."
