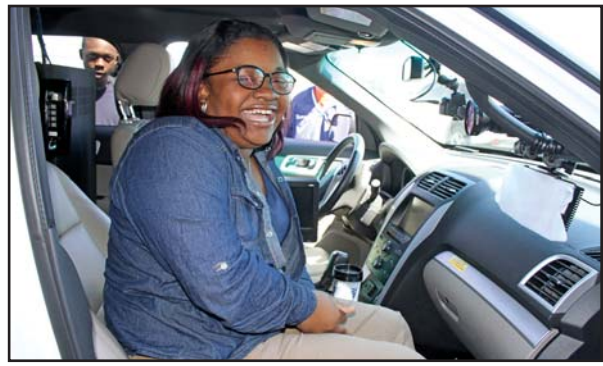




Meteorologists Visit Anson High School
