Full-Time Police Officer:

This position is a patrol position wherein typical police patrol duties will be assigned. The ideal candidate will have experience in sworn law enforcement in a rural setting, as officers in Polkton will handle cases from start to finish (with assistance from supervision and outside agencies as appropriate). The Full-Time position will be required to work a minimum of forty (40) hours per week, split "on-call" services (once fully trained) with the Chief of Police, and work overtime when deemed necessary. Starting salary for this position is \$32,500.00 but may be negotiable depending upon experience and training. This position also offers health, dental, vision, life insurance, vacation and sick time.

Part-Time Police Officer:

This position is a patrol position wherein typical police patrol duties will be assigned. The ideal candidate will have experience in sworn law enforcement in a rural setting, as officers in Polkton will handle cases from start to finish (with assistance from supervision and outside agencies as appropriate). The part-time position will be required to work a minimum of (20) twenty hours per week, but not to exceed (1000) one-thousand hours in a year. Starting pay for this position will be \$15.00 per hour.
