Remembering.....

Twin Valley Country Club

This one goes back a few years - many who golf at Twin Valley Country Club were not yet born when this club began. The original building was built just after the Depression years...in the mid 1930's, by the WPA. Many additions to the facilities have been made since.

I was talking with John Dunlap - he remembers as a boy, his first caddying job was for Rev. Paul Hardin, the First Methodist minister from 1935 to 1939. His pay was 50¢ for one round, and a "whole dollar" for two rounds.

Other experiences as "Twin Valley Golfers" were Bill Bias and John Livingston - another story!

I remember Dr. Frank "Skinny" Fetzer wanted me to

letter a bench at the club in 1937 or 1938. After getting a ride from Ansonville one Saturday morning, I went to get instructions from him at Fox & Lyon Drug Store - he finally got to work about 9 or 10 a.m. (after I had walked from the store to his house on Wanoka Circle and was told to go back to the store and wait!). He carried me out to the club house where I, after a considerable amount of time, finished lettering the bench "Fox & Lyon Drug Store."

I did get "slightly more than 75¢" for the above sign that I did on January 7, 1975. It is all steel construction - post, frame and ornamentation, with a hand-lettered baked aluminum sign panel.
