P STAGE, SEATING, AND SOUND

The first significant decision was to rent an elevated stage for better viewing and safety. Using an elevated stage involved changing the direction of seating. To utilize the entire seating capacity of the stadium the stage location was changed from the center of the field facing the press box to the field house end zone. In addition to the elevated stage, a professional audio system is used to ensure that

adequate sound and volume for music, speeches, and announcement of names is heard for the entire stadium. This change allows more parents and guests to attend. A photo of the stage arrangement (from last year's Commencement) is shown on page 8 of this edition of The Express.

P STUDENT SPEAKERS

A decision was made to eliminate a Commencement speaker and have a student from each school represent their school. The theme or prompt for each student speech focuses on the district's vision of "All means all" for an important reason - they began together and now end together. This year's theme is "The Legacy Continues... We Are Anson."

SENIOR AWARD NIGHT

Each school may honor their seniors in their school's tradition at a separate awards night scheduled by their school. This was decided to ensure that each school would be able to spend time recognizing student achievement, contribution, and accomplishments unique to their school and student body.

UNIFIED SCHOLARSHIP NIGHT

A dedicated scholarship night for all seniors receiving a scholarship was decided to allow for scholarship presenters to attend one evening event to honor their scholarship recipient. Additionally, this dedicated evening is intended to showcase the collective as well as individual accomplishment, achievement, and awards of the district's graduating seniors.

COMMENCEMENT PARTICIPATION

Three critical changes to the actual commencement exercises were also made. One was implemented last year, the second is being implemented this year, and the third will be implemented next year.

Honor Graduates (the first change)

The decision last year was to have all students march and sit in alphabetic order rather than in block seating with Honor Graduates being announced by their principal as they received their diplomas. This change was contentious with some parents. As was explained this is a unified commencement and honor students from all schools will be recognized. For example:

- Honor graduates are recognized in multiple ways names are noted in the program, they wear honor cords, and group photos are submitted to the press.
- Honor graduates are recognized as individuals and no longer as a block of students.

• Commencement Speakers (the second change)

The decision to shift from the Valedictorian as the class speaker to an open contest for all eligible seniors was made to expand participation in commencement exercises. Each school is following the same process for selection. The decision was based on several reasons including:

- Ombudsman does not have a Valedictorian and therefore is excluded from participating;
- Calculating academic honors is based exclusively on Grade Point Average (GPA) but is only one (1) of five (5) categories of district honors;
- GPA in and of itself is not reflective of speaking and presentation skills, nor does the highest GPA indicate that a student is representative of the graduating class;
- Auditioning for commencement speaker provides an opportunity for three (3) additional students to participate without the weighted 3.5 GPA; and
- Valedictorians will be announced and asked to stand be recognized before each school begins their commencement by their school principal.

• Staff Participation (the third change)

The decision to include staff and faculty in the commencement exercises will be implemented next year (Class of 2013). All staff and faculty will have the option to participate by leading the processional at the beginning of the commencement exercises. Staff and faculty will wear appropriate regalia commensurate with their earned college degrees.

Every effort has and will continue to be made to make the commencement exercises honoring to each graduating student and family irrespective of the school, their class rank or grade point average. The unified commencement and district scholarship night as well as the school specific activities are each an effort to celebrate the accomplishments, achievements, and contributions of each graduating senior.

Concerns, criticism, and conflict associated with a unified commencement are expected. Last year much effort was made to address each concern, question, or issue culminating with a commencement exercise that accomplished two important goals...1) each senior was recognized, and 2) the school system came together to honor each graduate.

We are anticipating the commencement exercises this year to be an event of honor, respect, and celebration for each student and their family. Dr. Gregory Firn
