### Tourism Development Authority Street Pole Banner Program



As part of Anson County Tourism Development Authority's commitment to promote tourism and encourage economic development, the ACTDA is rolling out a street banner program to enhance its streetscapes and promote the community. This is part of the countywide Wayfinding and Branding Project. Banners in the uptown core of Wadesboro are available for sponsorships. The decorative banners are seasonal for spring, summer, fall, Christmas and winter.

These banners are seasonal, semi-permanent installations that will be rotated five times per year. These banners are funded by local businesses or individuals as part of the public-private partnership efforts for Tourism and Economic Development in the county.

The themes and design are the responsibility of the Tourism Development Authority that developed the four seasonal and Christmas banners for individuals or businesses to fund or sponsor as a package set.

General Information - The vinyl street banners are sold as sets. The price per set is \$350. The lifespan of banners is approximately 3 years. TDA board members will assess banners on occasion for replacement and return damaged or worn banners. The Town of Wadesboro has agreed to install and change out the banners seasonally.


