House Bill 287 provides provisions:

• To prevent out of state commercial drivers from fraudulently obtaining NC's low rates

 To cap rate increases on Long Term Care Insurance Policies To bring transparency to the Consent to Rate process for homeowners

To reduce the volunteer firefighter shortage

To strengthen the penalties for fraud/theft by insurance fiduciaries

"North Carolina auto insurance rates are so low that individuals and companies

from other states are actually attempting to obtain our low rates illegally," said Goodwin. "I have added protections to these rates in this bill because low rates are a problem I am always happy to have.'

FSA County Committee Nomination Period is Open Now

Anson County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Jennifer Almond, announced that the nomination period for local FSA county commit-tees began on Wednesday, June 15. "County Committees are unique to FSA and allow producers to have a voice on federal farm program implementation at the local level," said Almond.

To be eligible to serve on a FSA county committee, a person must participate or cooperate in an FSA administered program, be eligible to vote in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area (LAA) where they are nominated. This year, nominations and elections will be held in LAA II, which includes Peachland, Wadesboro, and Lilesville townships.

Farmers and livestock producers may nominate themselves or others. Organizations representing minorities and women also may nominate candidates. To become a candidate, an eligible individual must sign an FSA-669A nomination form. The form and other information about FSA county committee elections are available at www.fsa.usda.gov /elections. 2016 nomination forms must be postmarked or received in the Anson County FSA Office by close of business on August 1, 2016.

Elected county committee members serve a three-year term and are responsible for making decisions on FSA disaster, conservation, commodity and price support programs, as well as other important federal farm program issues. County committees consist of three to 11 members. "It is important that county committees are comprised of members who fairly rep-

resent the diverse demographics of production agriculture for their community," said Almond. "All producers, including women, minority and beginning farmers and ranch-

ers are encouraged to participate in the nomination and election process.

FSA will mail election ballots to eligible voters beginning November 7, 2016. Ballots must be returned to the Anson county FSA office via mail or in person by December 5, 2016. Newlyelected committee members and alternates will take office on January 1, 2017.
