
#### Hampton B. Allen Library is Now Open


- They have a limit of 8 patrons allowed in the library at any given time.

# Farmer's Exchange Store

This time of year reminds me of the "early working days" of David C. Parker. He began business in a small brick building on Chesterfield Road.

Back then the Kiser brothers had a hot dog and hamburger sandwich shop right in the forks of Camden and Chesterfield Roads. On further back was Lewis Grocery Store that later became Carl's Food Center. Then, next on Chesterfield Road was Farmer's Exchange Store.

The picture above is a truck that I did on May 24, 1956, parked beside the Farmer's Exchange building. Note all the advertising there – Wayne Feeds, Seed, Baby

Chicks, Insecticides, Plants, Hotpoint Appliances and so on.

Many changes followed – such as closing out feed deliveries as they were, appliances, baby chicks - many other items.

David and Mary specialized in garden plants, seed, fertilizer and the like for the gardener. During some of the years they were involved in grower - starter pellets, etc. This was, of course, before we knew about Holly Farms, Tyson and others.

Many changes have since occurred. There are no more Kiser hot dogs, no Lewis Grocery, no Carl's Food Center – the entire "triangle area" now is IGA sore and parking area.

#### North Carolina's June Employment Figures Released

The state's seasonally adjusted June unemployment rate was 7.6 percent, decreasing 5.2 points from May's revised rate. The national rate decreased 2.2 percentage points to 11.1 percent.

North Carolina's June 2020 unemployment rate increased 3.6 percentage points from a year ago. The number of people employed increased 227,498 over the month to 4,428,221 and decreased 444,125 over the year. The number of people unemployed decreased 252,047 over the month to 363,465 and increased 160,976 over the year.

Seasonally adjusted Total Nonfarm industry employment, as gathered through the monthly establishment survey, increased 173,200 to 4,234,700 in June. Major industries experiencing increases were Leisure & Hospitality Services, 68,900; Trade, Transportation & Utilities, 22,300; Government, 20,800; Other Services, 19,600; Education & Health Services, 18,900; Professional & Business Services, 10,900; Manufacturing, 9,000; Construction, 1,800; and Financial Activities, 1,200. The only over-the-month decrease among major industries was in Information, 200. Mining & Logging employment remained unchanged over the month. Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates since June 2019:

June 2019 NC 4.0% / US 3.7%; July 2019 NC 3.9% / US 3.7%; August 2019 NC 3.8% / US 3.7%; Sep 2019 NC 3.7% / US 3.5%; Oct 2019 NC 3.7% / US 3.6%; Nov 2019 NC 3.6% / US 3.5%; Dec 2019 NC 3.6% / US 3.5%; Jan 2020 NC 3.6% / US 3.6%; Feb 2020 NC 3.6% / US 3.5%; Mar 2020 NC 4.3% / US 4.4%; Apr 2020 NC 12.9% / US 14.7%; May 2020 NC 12.8% / US 13,3%; June 2020 NC 7.6% / US 11.1% Since June 2019, Total Nonfarm jobs decreased 340,400 with the Total Private sector decreasing by 306,200 and Government decreasing by 34,200. The only over-the-year increase among major industries was in Financial Activities, 300. Major industries experiencing decreases were Leisure & Hospitality Services, 136,200; Education & Health Services, 39,800; Manufacturing, 38,100; Trade, Transportation & Utilities, 38,000; Professional & Business Services, 36,000; Government, 34,200; Construction, 11,200; Information, 4,700; Other Services, 2,200; and Mining & Logging, 300.
