Man Beaten, Shot in Foot at Pee Dee River Boat Landing

Anson County Sheriff's Deputies were called to the Pee Dee River boat landing on Thursday evening, July 17 at 7:40 p.m. for a report of a fight and shooting. Officers found William David Scott, 54, of Rockingham shot in the foot and badly beaten about the head. Scott was taken to the hospital and released the next day. Officers obtained warrants for assault charges on Michael Kevin Allen, 35 of Hamlet. Allen was charged with Assault Inflicting Serious Injury; Assault with a Deadly Weapon; Assault by Pointing a Gun, and Possession of a Handgun by a Convicted Felon. As of press time Allen has not be located but is believed to be in the Hamlet area.

Sheriff Tommy Allen said that it appeared that most of the subjects in this incident were from Richmond County. "Many of our calls from around that area are

dealing with people from across the river. Generally alcohol is a contributing factor to their problems. But overall we really don't have too many calls there. My officers and State Wildlife officers patrol the areas as we can," Sheriff Allen said. Anyone with any information as to

Marcilla Kay Hudson Arrested After Her 2 and 3 Year Old Children Found Walking on Road Unclothed and Hungry



On Tuesday, July 15 at about 1:15 Anson County Sheriff's Deputies were called to a rural area south of Wadesboro where two small children were found walking down a road with no clothing on. Deputies were called to a rural area off Gulledge Road, approximately seven

miles south of Wadesboro, after Pee Dee Electric personnel who were working in the area found the two small children, a two year old boy and a three year old girl, walking down the road. The children asked the men for food. The Pee Dee Electric personnel immediately used shirts to cover the children and called 911. When Deputies arrived the children were taken to a local volunteer fire department where they were given food, water and clothing from a volunteer.

Deputies went to a residence in the area but could not find any relatives. The Anson County Department of Social Serv ices was called to the scene and took custody of the children. Later the mother was located by Deputies and arrested. Deputies arrested Marcilla Kay Hudson, 22, of Wadesboro. Hudson was charged with: 1) Two counts of Child Abuse; and Two counts of Contributing to the Delinguency of a Minor. She was placed in the Anson County Jail under a \$2,000 bond. (She has since made bond).

DSS will maintain custody until a hearing is held to decide where the children will be placed.

Discover Anson Bicycle Ride Takes Place on New Date Year

The annual Discover Anson Bike Ride has a new date and a new starting location. This year's event will be held on Saturday, October 11, the same day as the new Taste of the Pee Dee celebration that replaces People Fest.

Registration begins at 8 a.m. at the First Baptist Church, located at 309 Lee Avenue in Wadesboro. The ride begins at 9 a.m. The entry fee is \$35 if you enter before September 26, \$40 after that. The annual ride for bicyclists includes a choice of a 26, 43 or 62 mile "metric century" ride. The 26 mile ride is mostly flat and suitable for the inexperienced rider. The 43 mile ride is hilly and a challenge to any experienced rider. For those who aren't "faint of heart" there is the 100 kilometer metric century ride (62-miles) to further test endurance. These rides will offer a scenic tour across the southern half of Anson County, with participants enjoying Piedmont features of North Carolina's foothills.

As riders enjoy the beautiful and scenic rolling hills of the Anson County countryside they will encounter many points of interest including the "James Bennett" house where Stephen Spielberg filmed *The Color Purple*, the old chimney of the Knox Inn in historic Sneedsborough, Long Pine Church, the oldest deeded Methodist church in NC, a climb up the "Devil's Backbone" near Meltonville Church, and the birthplace of Hugh Hammond Bennett, father of soil conservation. Riders will cycle through the communities of Paris, McFarlan, Cason Old Field, Mayesville, Deep Creek, and White Store. These communities, once thriving during the early history of Anson County, are now dominated by a long established church, a

country store or, perhaps, just a crossroads sign. After the ride participants can enjoy the festivities of the Taste of the Pee Dee celebration that takes place from 9 a.m.
