Virtual Summer Science Kits Developed by Lori Ingram and Wendy Efird at the Planetarium and Science Center

During the summer Anson County Schools was not able to host the Summer of Surprises nor the Science Summer Camps at the Wadesboro Rotary Planetarium and Science Center due to the pandemic. Mrs. Lori Ingram and Mrs. Wendy Efird, co-teachers at the Planetarium, created an idea to develop Virtual Science Summer Camp Kits so students could be involved with science education during the summer.

The kits were developed based on priority standards of science instruction. Anson County teachers were contacted in regards to the areas of science where weaknesses had been identified, which helped derive the basis for the activities at each grade level. Kits were developed for each grade level, K-5. The community was encouraged to come by the Anson County School District Office and pick up the kits.

Each week 60 kits were created and centered on one grade level each week. All kits were given out during the six week time period.

The response was fantastic, with many videos and pictures of students doing science experiments on the district's social media pages.
