Meadowview Terrace Holds Olympics

In a release from Meadowview Terrace: On Thursday, July 26 the activities room at Meadowview Terrace was swarming with excitement as 15 residents lined up to participate in Meadowview's first Olympic Games. The room was decorated with United States flags, Olympic rings framed the window and our hat tree was covered in red, white and blue hats.

There were three teams with 5 players each. The five games were Red, White and Blue Penny Pitch; Bean Bag Toss; Beach Ball Relay; Putting; and Noodle Javelin. There was some fierce competition between the teams. Out of the 15 Olympic players, seven women and one man made a hole in one in our Putting contest. The Bean Bag Toss had 3 points, toss into, 25 points, 50 points and 100 points, which was for the hardest hole to hit. We had six people to tie for the 100 pointer. Our Red, White and Blue Penny Pitch consisted of plastic wine glasses taped to a US Flag poster board. Each player was given 10 pennies to pitch. They received points for the amount of pennies that stayed in the glasses. We had one player to get 5 pennies in and the runner up got 4 pennies to stay in. For the Noodle Javelin we used swimming pool noodles. Each player had to see how far they could throw them. Each player got three tries.

The Beach Ball Relay was a timed event. All three teams lined up facing 3 volunteers. The volunteers would toss the beach ball to a player. They had to catch the ball, throw it back, and run to the back of the line so the next player could take their turn. We didn't know they could move so fast.

- "Team B" had Ms. Burnette, Ms. Rose, Ms. Jean and Mr. John on it and they came in 1st place and each player received a gold medal.
- "Team A" had Ms. Martha, Ms. Betty, Ms. Altha, Ms. Ginger and Ms. Wanda and they came in 2nd place, and each player received a silver medal.
- "Team C" had Ms. Mary, Ms. Elsie, Ms. Rose, Ms. Rachel and Ms. Sarah and they came in 3rd place and each of these players received a bronze medal.

All players also received a red rose.

We would like to thank all of the volunteers who made this such an exciting day. Our thanks go to Heather and Calvin Lambert, Millie Snodgrass, Sandra Fisher, Teresa Pope and
