**Extension Notes
Critical Documents in
Case of Disaster**

September is the first month of fall, when most of the kids head back to school, and the traditional month to remember being prepared in case of natural disaster. With all the weather related disasters in other parts of the country, taking precautions now is advisable. When disaster strikes, your immediate concern will be your safety and the safety of those you care about. Once the immediate danger passes, however, having your financial and medical records and important contact information will be crucial to help you start the recovery process quickly. Taking time now to safeguard these critical documents will give you peace of mind, ensure you have access to essential medical and prescription information, and help you avoid additional stress during the difficult days following a disaster. In addition, take the time now to think about the priceless personal items you would want to protect from damage or take with you if you had to suddenly evacuate your home. The first step is to take an inventory of your household documents, contacts, and valuables. Prepare a list based on that inventory. Make copies of needed documents and keep with your list. Be sure to include emergency contact phone numbers or other contact information with your documentation for questions that may arise following a disaster. Make copies of identification documents, such as birth, marriage, child custody papers, driver's licenses, Social Security cards, even pet ownership papers. Also include financial records, such as banking accounts, credit and debit cards, and investment accounts. Secure copies of insurance policies, legal documents, and even vehicle titles and VIN numbers. Be sure to have copies of medical information for everyone such as health/dental insurance, Medicare, Medicaid, and VA health benefits. Also keep a list of medications, immunizations, allergies, prescriptions, and pharmacy information. You will also want to make a list of priceless personal mementos, family photos, and keepsakes. Inventory possessions with monetary value, including jewelry, art, and collectibles, and document worth. Once you have gathered your financial, legal, and contact information, it is essential to safeguard this information. Consider storing paper copies of important documents at home in a fireproof and waterproof box or safe, in a bank safe deposit box, or with a trusted friend or relative. If you are using a safe deposit box, you may want to ask your bank or check state laws to confirm who can and cannot access the safe deposit box if the lessee dies or is incapacitated. Store electronic copies of important documents in a password-protected format on a removable flash or external hard drive in your fireproof and waterproof box or safe, or consider using a secure cloud-based service.
