**Ansonville Historical Society**

Quite a few years ago the building that now houses the Ansonville Historical Society Museum was a new brick building built before World War II, located on Highway 52 close to the entrance to the Ansonville High School. Later it was sold to Doctor Lubchenco who practiced medicine in Ansonville for a number of years. Lucy Lubchenco was one of his children in the high school who graduated in 1939.

The next tenant was the Ansonville High School home economics class. Part of the General Smith fund was used for the first home economics "home." Also, next door was the new building housing the first Shop/Agriculture Department, both of which began classes, I think, about 1937.

I do have many fond memories of the shop building after using a "star drill" and a 4 pound hammer to install all the power tools to the concrete floor - no electric drills, just a "heavy hammer!"

Remember the ball field across the road, where at recess time "the team would draw sides" - names of available players, then have a ball game! And, no, I didn't get to play much - usually an "old stray hound" would get my place!!

Anyway, the area now makes a better Fire Department, as well as sending a better service to the community...and barbecue too!

As we do remember back more than 50 years ago, it all began with the purchase of three hundred pounds of pork for the "first fundraiser barbecue." Everyone was worried about whether or not they would sell all that barbecue. Daddy (Ed McBride, Sr.) cooked it "down at the tobacco barn" on a brick and steel cooking unit that he had built - "very slowly," "very tender," "very tasty" - all cut up by some of the firemen on Mamma's kitchen table. Now I am told that instead of 300 pounds of pork purchased, it is something like 10,000 pounds - it do make a DIFFERENCE!

And, the sign at the museum is hopefully a real beginning of a super historical museum collection. Ed

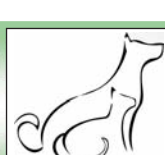

**Free Pesticide Collection Day is November 13**

Do you have pesticides at your home or farm that you no longer need or use? If your answer is 'yes,' then you'll be interested in the Anson County Pesticide Collection Day on Thursday, November 13.

The Anson County Extension Office, in cooperation with the NC Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Pesticide Disposal Assistance Program, a non-regulatory and cost-free program, will be offering this Pesticide Collection Day for residents in Anson County and all of the surrounding North Carolina counties.

County Agricultural Extension Agent Jessica Morgan will be the local contact for the event. The collection will run from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Anson County Farmers Market on Highway 52 South.

Nearly all pesticide products will be accepted at this amnesty collection event, including banned and out-dated pesticides. For pesticides with unreadable or missing labels, please contact the Cooperative Extension Office for instructions. Please save any portion of the label to help identify the material so you can be assisted with disposal. Unknown materials cannot be accepted.

For pressurized pesticide gas cylinders or containers greater than 5 gal in size, please contact the Extension Office before the collection day for special instructions and information. For tips on transporting the pesticides safely to the collection event contact the Extension Office at 704-694-2415..

Each year the Pesticide Disposal Assistance Program visits between 40-50 counties to collect unwanted and unused pesticides. This means that a collection day of this kind only happens about once every other year in each county. Don't miss this opportunity in Anson County. It is co-sponsored by NCDA & CS and the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service.
