

Absentee by Mail is closed. The deadline to apply was Tuesday, October 29, 2013. One-stop voting (early voting) wends on Saturday, November 2 at the Charles Riddle

Staff Development Center, located at 320 Camden Road in Wadesboro. (Enter parking lot across from Wadesboro Elementary School.) The hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturday November 2, from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. In person registration (and voting) will be available during One-stop voting but not on Election Day. Only the Town of Morven does not offer Absentee Voting.

Absentee meetings: The Anson County Board of Elections will meet to approve applications

for absentee ballots for the November 5 Municipal Election at the Board of Elections office at 2 p.m. on November 5. Other business may be transacted by the board at this time. Absentee by Mail ballots will be counted at that meeting. Results for Absentee Mail and One-Stop voting will be reported after polls close at 7:30 p.m. The Canvass Day meeting will be held in the Board of Elections Office on Tueday, November 12 at 11 a.m.
