at the First Presbyterian Church fellowship hall in Wadesboro. The cost is \$40 and includes lunch.

The workshop will focus on writing longer poems that tell stories using classic conventions of fiction, dialogue, plot, conflict, characterization, setting, etc., while still relying on key elements of poetry.

"We will strive to balance the imaged-charged voltage of poetry with traditionally discursive narrative strategies of fiction and creative non-fiction," Bathanti said. "We will focus on the occasion of the poem, and the dramatic situation that inspired it."

Participants will be provided with examples of narrative poems aimed at triggering the narrative impulse.

Bathanti is professor of English and McFarlane Family Distinguished Professor of Interdisciplinary Education and writer-in-residence at Appalachian State University's Watauga Residential College. He is a former Poet Laureate of North Carolina and recently received the Lee Smith Award



Ballard's Store

This one goes back many years, to 1940. There was a lot going on in Polkton - the shirt factory was across the street, Lum Harrington's grocery, George Preslar's grocery, Fred Horne's seed cleaners, Gene Godwin's pool room, and lots of activity around the depot. You see, at that time there passenger trains through...and stopping, too. Then there was Scarboro Lumber Company, T. R. Troutman's Gulf station, Henry Spears' Studebaker agency, and "Mrs. Ledbetter's" US Post Office - plus so much "other goings-on!!"

Tom Ballard (my uncle) came to Polkton in 1940, opening his business in one building, then later moving next door, where he operated for a number of years before purchasing that building. He was active until sickness, then later his death, caused the store's closing in 1981.

Ballard's Store was quite a unique business - selling not only groceries, but small hardware items, such as tools, pots, pans and the like, some dry goods, mens hats, horse/cow feed. In fact, it was a small "general store" with even Gulf kerosene for lamps, delivered by Mr. Dabbs, carried into the store in 5

gallon cans, two at a time, and poured into a hand-cranked pump tank - ready for the customer whether a quart, a gallon or more!!

During the maneuvers, sometimes I could not get the door open fast enough! The G.I.'s were buying soft drinks, pork and beans, cookies, candy - anything, they said, would beat their "field rations!" They seemed amazed to see such an "assorted inventory" down south!!

Ballard's Store, of course, had the only telephone in Polkton (a pay phone). Many nights Uncle Tom was awakened to go call a doctor or other emergency needing a telephone - such as a death. What would today's population have done? Oh well - another time!

Remembering...so many good people, so many good things, so many who have lived and served, too.

About to forget - even though I lettered the front windows several times during the years, the above picture shows the last one that I did. I lettered both windows, the door too - and the Royal Crown Cola sign hanging over the sidewalk, I did that for Adam Hardison of Pee Dee Bottling Company...many "moons" ago!!
