Wadesboro Police Checkpoint Snares Drunk Drivers

The Wadesboro Police Department, along with the assistance and coordination of several outside law enforcement agencies stretching from Moore, Stanly, Scotland and Union Counties, participated in a multi-agency DWI checkpoint which was located on Highway 74 at Wade Manufacturing.

"Our goal at the Wadesboro Police Department and the North Carolina Governors Highway Safety Program is to promote highway safety awareness to reduce the number of traffic crashes and fatalities in the state of North Carolina and also Wadesboro," Wadesboro Police Chief Thedis Spencer said. "With diligent planning and execution of the checkpoint, it allowed officers to find those who do not obey the law by drinking and driving and get them off the roadway to make a safer community for those who travel. With over 20 years of the slogan that's known across the country 'Booze It & Lose It,' nearly 8,500 people have lost their lives in crashes involving alcohol. One death is one too many just from one person drinking and driving, while making a terrible decision that could cause another's life."

Chief Spencer continued, "The checkpoint may have saved a life thanks to the strong enforcement.

Officer Scott Gulledge with the Wadesboro Police Department prepared and hosted this checkpoint with his role as the County Coordinator of the North Carolina Governors Highway Safety Program. Officers issued over 59 charges, including driving while impaired offenses and several drug violations.



Those who were caught and charged were placed under arrest with a Magistrate on scene aboard the "Bat Mobile' that was provided by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services Division. Those who were placed under arrest were then placed in the Anson County Sheriff's Office custody while waiting in the jail van that Anson County Sheriff Landric Reid provided to be on scene. With the help of Anson Safe Kids, five child seats were checked and corrected on scene at the checkpoint assuring the safety of those children leaving from the location.

"This checkpoint is one of many that are planned in the future as a reminder - to prevent future tragedies from occurring," said Spencer. "If you make the decision to drink and drive, you will get caught - day or night. We as a department are dedicated to ensure the safety of our community and to safe travels on the streets and highways with strong enforcement.

Anson Farmers Eligible for Emergency Loan Assistance

On October 26 President Obama declared a major disaster in the State of South Carolina based on damages and losses caused by severe storms and flooding that occurred from October 1 to 23, 2015. In accordance with Section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, six adjacent counties in North Carolina are named as contiguous counties where eligible family farmers may qualify for FSA emergency (EM) loan assistance. These counties are Anson, Mecklenburg, Richmond, Robeson, Scotland and Union.

Effective October 26 farmers in Anson County may apply for EM loans for physical and production losses. June 27 2016, is the deadline for filing an application. The local office is located at 3230-A Presson Road, Monroe, NC 28112-9196, with office hours of 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Any farmer who suffered a physical or production loss should contact his/her office for additional information.

Compare Health Insurance Plans During Enrollment Period

Insurance Commissioner Wayne Goodwin reminds North Carolinians who purchase individual health insurance coverage to take advantage of the open enrollment period to compare plans and choose coverage. The open enrollment period for 2016 coverage began on November 1 and ends January 31, 2016. In order to have coverage effective January $1,\,2016,\,$ you must enroll by December $15,\,2015.$

"I encourage people to take action during the open enrollment period," Goodwin said. Look at your options and decide if it's in your best interest to keep the plan you had last year, switch to another plan or change insurance companies. If you do not get health coverage through your employer or Medicare, you can buy

coverage in the individual market on the federal exchange at www.healthcare.gov. The exchange also determines if you are eligible for any subsidies, cost-sharing reductions or coverage through Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program. If you purchased individual health insurance last year, you will be auto-enrolled in the

same or similar plan unless you select a different plan. However, you should still verify your information, confirm your subsidy eligibility and look at the available policies. There may be a new option that is less expensive or better suits your needs. When choosing a plan, it's also important to check to see which medical providers (physicians, hospitals, labs, pharmacies, etc.) you may visit to receive covered care. You may also purchase individual coverage off the exchange through an agent or broker

or directly from an insurance company, but you will not be eligible for subsidies. If you have questions about health insurance, contact the North Carolina Department

of Insurance at 855-408-1212 or learn more at www.ncdoi.com. For questions related directly to enrollment through the federal exchange, contact 1-800-318-2596 or visit www.healthcare.gov/contact-us.
