Arts Council Puts Spotlight On Tommy Wooten His play A Christmas Story is opening at the Ansonia this weekend

A native of North Carolina, Tommy Wooten has had a professional career that has spanned over 25 years. After studying theatre at Liberty University Wooten moved to Orlando, Florida and began working in various regional theatres. Favorite roles include Wally in 1940's Radio Hour (Best Actor Award 1994, Ice House Theatre), Richard in Andrea's Got Two Boyfriends (Best Actor Award 2002 Orlando Fringe Festival), Adam in The Most Fabulous Story Ever Told, Captain Hook in Peter Pan, Roy in Lone Star (Best Show 2001 Orlando International Fringe Festival) and Marty in The House of Yes.



In 1994 he became a contracted performer with

Universal Studios where he performed in several shows over the next 15 years. He grew from performing to guest directing, and in 2007 was made Show Director of Talent Casting and Booking. In 2001 Wooten started his own theatre company, Pot Luck Productions, and produced several successful shows over the next eight years until he moved to NYC in 2009. There he performed Off-Broadway and won the Jack Lemmon Award for Best Actor for his role of Dr. Livingston in the hit show Dragness of God. Other NYC credits include Zuly and the Last Place on Earth, The Ladies of Eola Heights and a role in the original workshop cast for the new Off Broadway hit Disenchanted.

Wooten moved back to North Carolina in 2011, and soon began directing at the Ansonia Theatre. His shows have proven to be huge box office and critical successes, including The Trip to Bountiful, Crimes of the Heart, Godspell and most recently, a sold-out run of Steel Magnolias. In addition, he has directed The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, Driving Miss Daisy, The Best Christmas Pageant Ever!, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Lone Star Laundry and Bourbon, Brighton Beach Memoirs, Blood Brothers, On Golden Pond, Commencement, To Kill a Mockingbird, Annie, Graceland, Smoke on the Mountain, Big River, Our Town, and is now has A Christmas Story opening this Friday, December 7.

Wooten also started a youth program at the Ansonia in 2014 with an 'Introduction to Theatre' Summer Camp, which has now grown to two separate workshops. The workshops culminate in an impressive production showcasing the students' own writing and acting skills.

The Ansonia theatre and the Anson County Arts Council released a statement about Wooten: "We are beyond blessed and lucky to have the amazing Tommy Wooten. Even though we can't imagine it at the time, each show really does get better than the last! We have become a destination, and are regarded as high quality theatre with not-to-be-missed productions ... and we couldn't have done it without Tommy! We love you, Tommy! The spotlight is on YOU!
