Flu Shots Now Available at the Anson Health Department

Winter is still here, and with the lower temperatures flu season is upon us. The Anson County Health Department wants to inform the public about influenza (flu)

and how the department can help prevent the deadly virus. In the United States flu is detected year-round, however, it is most common during the

November. Flu activity peaks between December and February and can last as late as May. Flu is a transmittable breathing illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. The best way to prevent flu is by getting a flu vaccine each year. Flu is different from a cold and can come on suddenly. Flu symptoms involve:

fall and winter months. Influenza activity often begins to increase in October and

fever • cough • sore throat • runny or stuffy nose • body aches

headache
 chills
 fatigue
 sometimes diarrhea and vomiting

Although fever symptoms are included, not everyone may have a fever when catching flu. Research shows that flu is spread through tiny droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk. These tiny droplets can land on people nearby. People with flu are most contagious the first 3-4 days. The Center for disease control (CDC) recommends everyone over the age of 6 months

should get the flu vaccine each season.

It is especially important for the following high risk groups:

- \bullet pregnant women \bullet people of any age with certain chronic medical conditions
- children younger than 5, but especially children younger than 2 years old • people 50 years of age and older • healthcare workers
- people who live in nursing homes and other long-term care facilities
- people who live with or care for those at high risk for complications from flu fatigue
- household contacts of persons at high risk for complications from the flu
- household contacts and out of home caregivers of children less than 6 months of age.
- The Health Department offers appointments for flu shots but will also provide walk-in times from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The health department accepts the following primary insurance for the influenza vaccination: Medicare, Medicaid, Medcost, Aetna, Cigna, Blue Cross Blue Shield, and United Healthcare.

Children without insurance coverage ages 6 months through 18 years of age may receive a free influenza vaccination. Please bring in all insurance cards for verification of primary insurance coverage. The costs for individuals without ctive primary insurance coverage are: Influenza \$51 and High Dose Influenza \$96.

The Ryan White Program at the Health Department

Throughout the cold winter month of December, the Anson County Health Department is participating in World AIDS Day. World AIDS Day is used to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS, encourage people to get tested, and take action to support people living with HIV. World AIDS Day is a worldwide benefit to raise awareness, fight prejudgment,

and improve education about HIV, the virus that causes AIDS. World AIDS Day is Around the world, about 37 million people are living with HIV. In the United States,

about 38,500 people get infected with HIV every year. The only way to know if you have HIV is to get tested. It's important that everyone ages 15 to 65 gets tested for HIV at least once. Some people may need to get tested more often. Some people living with HIV may have little to no access to health care

resources than others living with HIV. This may be due to: No health insurance
 Fewer financial resources
 Less access to transportation

- Fewer health care resources available in the area
 Lack of housing
- Lack of emotional or physical support
- Fear of telling their family about their HIV
- This is why it is important to create awareness amongst HIV/AIDS and inform

those about the resources that are available such as the Ryan White Program. The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program provides primary medical care and support services for people living with HIV who are uninsured or underinsured. The Program works with cities, states, and local community-based organizations to provide HIV care and treatment services to more than half a million people each year. The Program reaches approximately 52% of all people diagnosed with HIV in the United States. The Program serves as an important source of ongoing access to HIV medication that can enable people living with HIV to live close to normal lifespans

The Ryan White program covers people affected by HIV in Anson, Cabarrus, Gaston, Mecklenburg, Union Counties, North Carolina; and York County, South Carolina. The program provides resources such as:

Medical, dental, and vision care
 Health insurance assistance
 Housing

- Transportation Child care and family services Employment assistance Mental health and substance use
 Food, clothing, and financial assistance
