Lead Pastor of Harvest Ministries Steve Adams stated, "Many times those who have been 'labeled' as disabled may not have opportunities to enjoy the Christmas festivities as others, so the whole purpose of today is to show the love of Christ and celebrate in a big way."

The 100 or so children, adults and teenagers in attendance literally had a party. Leon Gatewood and his brother "DJ Gate-3" (Minister Curtis Gatewood) provided music, staff of Harvest hosted games, gave away prizes, and served refreshments. Local special need group home staff and residents attended and had a blast dancing and hanging out.

Elder Kareem Ellerbe of Harvest Ministries, who grew up with a learning disability and speech impediment, encouraged those in attendance to not allow others to "dis" their disability, but to know how special they are to God and everyone around them. Also Pastor Brenda Adams of Harvest shared her journey with Multiple Sclerosis (MS), and that while there are days of pain - and some are better than others - it does not define who God made her.
