### Clean Water Trust Fund Take Lead in Protecting State's Water Quality

As North Carolina continues to experience substantial population growth, the importance of protecting the state's sources of water becomes even more important. Sediment from erosion and pollutants in storm water runoff are two of the biggest threats to water quality. The N.C. Clean Water Management Trust Fund, at the forefront of the effort to protect the state's surface water, recently provided grants to protect surface water on 29 sites encompassing more than 16,000 acres, and to restore more than 70,000 feet of stream banks. "Investments to limit erosion, improve storm water management and buffer our streams and rivers are a critical

piece of the State's plan to ensure current and future generations have access to clean drinking water," said CWMTF Executive Director Bryan Gossage. "Beyond protecting our rivers, streams and lakes, special elements of nature that exist in the Tar Heel state -and sometimes nowhere else - also benefit from the grants provided by the Fund." The Fund is also tasked in legislation with conservation efforts aimed at conserving the state's "natural heritage, species of plants or animals that are globally rare, and sometimes found only in North Carolina. Working together

with conservation partners, grants are provided annually to project applicants from throughout the state.

In the just-completed 2015 grant cycle, two water quality projects in Columbus County received nearly a half million dollars for Lake Waccamaw and the Waccamaw River, while approximately \$330,000 will help protect an emergency drinking water supply for the Town of Weaverville in the headwaters of Reems Creek, a tributary to the French Broad River. In all, \$19.3 million was provided to 50 conservation projects in 30 different counties to: 1) Conserve 16,295

acres of riparian buffers and ecological communities; 2) Restore 70,565 linear feet of stream banks; and 3) Purchase 3.37 miles of greenway corridors. About the Clean Water Management Trust Fund: The Clean Water Management Trust Fund was established in 1996 to protect the state's drinking water sources. Today, with more than \$55 million in active contracts, the fund

is additionally tasked by the North Carolina General Assembly with conserving or protecting the state's natural re-

based on losses caused by excessive rain and flooding that occurred September 22, 2015 to October 4, 2015. As a result of this natural disaster, 11 North Carolina counties were declared eligible for Federal disaster assistance, including Farm Service Agency (FSA) emergency (EM) loans for eligible family farmers. Those primary disaster counties are: Bertie, Gates, Pamlico, Bladen, Hertford, Union, Caswell, Hoke and Warren. In addition to those 11 primary disaster counties, 29 additional North Carolina counties are named as contiguous counties

where eligible family farmers may qualify for FSA EM loan assistance, in accordance with Section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act. Those counties are: Alamance, Columbus, Mecklenburg, Pender, Rockingham, Anson, Craven, Moore, Perquimans, Sampson, Beaufort, Franklin, Nash, Person, Scotland, Cabarrus, Halifax, Orange, Richmond, Stanly, Camden, Harnett, Pasquotank, Robeson, Vance, Carteret, Hyde, Chowan and Martin. Suzanne Simpson, Farm Loan Manager for FSA, said that effective November 4, 2015, farmers in Anson may

apply for EM loans for production losses. July 5, 2016 is the deadline for filing an application. The local office is located at 3230 A Presson Roan in Monroe 28112-9196 and has office hours of 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Simpson said that any farmer who suffered a physical and production loss should contact his/her office for additional information.
