Hospital Gets New High Level CT Scanner

Physicians, patients, and employees at Anson Community Hospital have a new reason to smile. The hospital just replaced their eight-year-old CT scanner with a new, 16-slice GE Brightspeed CT that significantly improves the quality of medical imaging at the hospital.

The GE Brightspeed scanner, which acquires 16 CT slices simultaneously, is far more advanced and provides superior imaging compared to the old scanner. It is also much faster according to Dr. Carolyn Pomeroy, Anson Community Hospital's Radiologist.



"This is a big advantage as quicker results are essential, especially for patients from the Emergency Department who may have a life threatening condition." "It allows the physician on duty in the ED to make decisions regarding treatment almost immediately, if necessary", she said.

CT scanning, meaning computerized tomography, is a powerful X-ray tool that allows Radiologists to look at parts of

powerful X-ray tool that allows Radiologists to look at parts of the body in cross section and in multiple planes. A CT scan is used to diagnose serious illness or injury - especially when the cause or symptoms are not easily detectable with a conventional physical exam. A multi-slice scanner, like the new machine, makes multiple CT cuts simultaneously, making the examination much quicker, more accurate, and provides greater clarity of internal organs, bone, soft tissue and blood vessels than a normal x-ray.

"A CT scan has become one of the most important tools in diagnosing problems such as head and spine injuries, cancers, cardiovascular disease, infectious disease, trauma and musculoskeletal disorders as well as other diseases and illnesses," adds Dr. Pomeroy. "The new GE Brightspeed will definitely

help us in our goal to provide patients at Anson Community Hospital with state-of-the-art medical care and treatment."


