## Jessica Morgan Won Statewide Discussion Meet Title



Anson County young farmer Jessica Morgan took First Place honors recently in North Carolina Farm Bureau's (NCFB) statewide Discussion Meet. The competition and award ceremony took place during NCFB's 82nd Annual Meeting, held December 3-5 at the Joseph S. Koury Convention Center in Greensboro. "It is important that we support and help develop

young farmers who are able to speak up and speak out for farmers and their rural communities," said Larry Wooten, President

of North Carolina Farm Bureau. "This program helps develop rural leaders for the future.

The Discussion Meet Award recognizes a young farmer between the ages of 18 and 35 who is involved in NCFB's Young Farmers and Ranchers Program (YF&R) program. Morgan's knowledge of agricultural issues and public speaking and debate skills were judged to be the most effective in regard to consensus-building on some of

the real issues impacting today's agricultural industry. Morgan now moves on to the national competition where she will vie against other state Farm Bureau winners during American Farm Bureau Federation's national Discussion Meet, held in conjunction with the organization's annual meeting, January 5-10 in Nashville, Tenn.

### NCDA&CS Announces Healthy **Food Small Retailer Funding**

#### Priority application deadline is January 31

The North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services will offer grant assistance to convenience stores interested in offering healthier food options to those living in food deserts in North Carolina.

"There are 349 food deserts across North Carolina, impacting about 1.5 million North Carolinians, Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Corner stores and convenient stores are integral parts of their local communities, and can play an important role in bringing healthy local foods to the neighborhoods they serve.

The funding is a part of the Healthy Food Small Retailer Program, which is administered by the department. The program was established in the 2016 state budget bill (HB 1030). The 2017-2018 program will reimburse participating stores for refrigeration, freezers and stocking equipment needed to offer healthier items.

Store owners have until Jan. 31 to apply for priority consideration. Applications will continue to be accepted until March 30, subject to availability of funds.

In addition to being in a food desert (online search available at www.ers.usda.gov/data-products/food-access-research-atlas), store owners applying for funding under HFSRP must meet the following criteria:

Accept or agree to accept Supplemental Nutrition As-

sistance Program (SNAP) benefits;

 Accept or agree to apply to accept Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) benefits; Have no more than 3,000 square feet of heated floor space;

Be established as a forprofit business at time of appli-

 Have not previously received HFSRP funds. Interested store owners can find more information


