Annual Toll Rate Increase for the Triangle and Monroe Expressways

The annual toll rate increase for the Triangle Expressway nd Monroe Expressway took effect Monday, January 1.

The North Carolina Turnpike Authority Board adopted schedules of incremental annual toll rate increases for both the Triangle Expressway and Monroe Expressway based on the financing requirements for each project.

NC Quick Pass customers with a transponder driving a Class 1 or 2-Axle vehicle, traveling the full length of the Triangle Expressway, 18.8 miles, the cost will increase 14 cents to \$3.94, or 3.68 percent. NC Quick Pass customers with a transponder driving a Class 1 or 2-Axle vehicle, traveling the full length of the Monroe Expressway, 19.8 miles, the cost will increase 8 cents to \$2.85, or 2.89 percent. The full toll rate schedule for both facilities is available online.

Toll revenue is used to pay off bonds sold to fund construction, as well as support the operations and maintenance of each toll facility.

Switch to a different Medicare Advantage Plan with or

without drug coverage.

Medicare Prescription Drug Plan: (medicare.gov/drug-coverage-part-d).

If you switch Medicare Advantage Plans or go back to Original Medicare with or without a Medicare drug plan, your new coverage will start the first day of the month after your new plan gets your request for coverage. Keep in mind, if you go back to Original Medicare now, you may not be able to buy a Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) policy.



ACORNS is a free service that allows individuals to receive notifications sent from National Weather Service (NWS) and local authorities to stay informed on potentially hazardous situations involving weather, traffic and other emergencies, including the spread of the

coronavirus.

Individuals who are signed up for alerts will receive reliable information from county officials, including tailored updates based on their specific needs and geographic location.
