no more than 1.5 feet below full pond. However, lake level fluctuations are allowed to be as much as 3 feet below full pond during the December 15 and March 1 time frame. If storage is needed for electrical generation purposes during this period, Duke Energy Progress may reduce the lake level by as much as 5 feet below full pond. This would only occur if there were no other options to meet the electric system demand. Water fluctuations of up to 8 feet may occur during system emergencies and potentially be greater during drought periods.
