There is a lot more that she contributed to the history of this county and state, but what she was most fond is of is what God did through her for His kingdom. She was a true missionary who saw after the sick. She participated in many fundraisers that built two churches - Cedar Creek Missionary Baptist Church and Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church, where she became a member as well, while helping

many other ministries: She joined Word of Faith Ministries on Mother's Day 2008 where she became the Mother of the Church and remained faithful until her health gave way. She was truly one who believed everyone is God's child. She was devoted to her family and cared for and nurtured many other children in and around her community. Even though she faced many dangers, toils, tortures and snares, she was faithful, never tiring, always positive! No matter what she was through, when you asked her was she okay, her reply would always be, "I'm fine!"
