soon as you get paid? The

real poverty of typical families is found neither in their low income nor in costly essential expenses, but rather in not understanding their own cash flow. What is a cash flow statement and why is it so impor-

tant? A cash flow statement is part of your business's financial statements, which include these: An income statement; a balance sheet; and a cash flow statement. However, a cash flow statement isn't just something you prepare and put in a drawer to never look at again. Used correctly it can be a vital tool for managing your business and planning ahead for financing needs. Ideally, you want to maintain a positive cash flow at all times. This ensures you have the funds available that vou need to pay your bills, pay employees, and purchase inventory or assets in a timely fashion. In reality, of course, many businesses find that from time to time, their cash flow is negative. Or perhaps it's an ongoing problem: You are doing fine on paper in terms of profitability, but somehow find that you frequently run short of cash. Reviewing your cash flow statement regularly can help you spot this tupe of cyclical pattern in your business and prevent a cash flow emergency.

After getting a ride from Ansonville one Saturday morning, I went to get instructions from him at Fox & Lyon Drug Store - he finally got to work about 9 or 10 a.m. (after I had walked from the store to his house on Wanoka Circle and was told to go back to the store and wait!). He carried me out to the club house where I, after a considerable amount of time, finished lettering the bench "Fox & Lyon Drug Store."

I did get "slightly more than 75¢" for the above sign that I did on January 7, 1975. It is all steel construction post, frame and ornamentation, I remember Dr. Frank with a hand-lettered baked
