Jean Howard to be Inducted **Into Drag Racing Hall of Fame**

Long time drag racer, Jean Howard of Polkton, earned induction into the North Carolina Drag Racing Hall of Fame after her long and successful racing career. Howard will be inducted on Saturday, February 18, along with NASCAR legend Richard Petty, Terry Adams and Frank Teague.

A spokesman for the NC Drag Racing Hall of Fame said, '2017 will mark the first time that 'Grass Roots' drag racers dominate the inductees into the Hall of Fame. First of all...how many raced against Polkton, NC's Jean Howard? I did...and she's been a force in the Carolinas ever since her first start in 1964.'

Jean Howard said, "I followed my two brothers, and they would let me make practice runs. So, when my brother was drafted into the Army in the 1960's, I took his ride and he never got it back!'

Among many many wins and accolades, Howard said that her biggest achievement was the IHRA victory on the "pit road" drag strip at the Charlotte Motor Speedway in 1973. Her favorite car was the 1969 Z/28 Chevrolet Camaro pictured below.

Howard said, "My biggest rival was Roy Johnson, father of NHRA Pro Stock racer Allen Johnson. Major influences in my life are my family...Dad, Mom and my two brothers.
