On Sunday, February 11 at approximately 11:45 p.m. deputies with the Anson County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to 317 Firetower Road in Wadesboro for a welfare check. When deputies arrived on the scene they located a female identified as Dorothy Lorraine

Deputies asked Anson County Emergency Services to respond to the scene, where they pronounced Ms. Allen deceased. Deputies said it appeared that Dorothy Allen's cause of death Cherise Allen was blunt force trauma, but they were waiting for the medical examiner to confirm that information. Deputies were able to identify a suspect, 31-year-old

arrested and charged with Murder. The Anson County Sheriff's Office and North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation are currently working jointly on the case, and this is an ongoing investigation.
