### **Ministry to Help People Get Out of Poverty** Called NETworX Begins Operations in Anson County

Anson NETworX for Hope invites the community to participate in an informative meeting Saturday, February 18, at First United Methodist Church, located at 118 East Morgan Street in Wadesboro. The meeting is from 9:00 to 11:45 a.m. Lunch will be provided.

NETworX, formerly Circles, is a program designed to build relationships across lines of socioeconomic class, culture and race with the goal of helping organize people for a better life. NETworX strategy is not to end poverty though the well-doing for others but through the well-being together. It is individuals and communities seeking together to build intentional relationships through education and love of neighbor as well as love of self.

Under the leadership of Pastor Norma Villagrana, the new ministry will help people move from poverty to self-sufficiency. Villagrana believes that NETworX will bring a new and fresh start to our community

"Anson County was one of the 64 Circles sites across America that made a positive impact in this community. Circles empowered families with the knowledge and social capital they need to overcome the barriers of life in poverty and become self-sustaining, Villagrana said. "NETworX is a faith-based program committed to the core values of love for the neighbor and transforming lives.

Villagrana said that NETworX brings together members of the community who are middle class (called "Allies") and members of the community (called "Champions of Change"). An Ally is an individual working with Champions to overcome obstacles and reach their goals, and a Champion of Change is an individual who wants to improve his/her life and to make changes to move toward greater well-being. "This is what NETworX does," she said.

Pastor Norma Villagrana

Villagrana was born and raised in Torreon, Coahuila, Mexico. She graduated from the School of Law in Mexico. For several years she worked in a law firm and later became Director of Technical School in her native town. She and her family moved to the United States in 2002, and along with her husband, Hector, they become missionaries for the Missouri Conference of the NEW

United Methodist Church.
