· Have your cholesterol checked. Levels need to be checked at least every five years. Manage your diabetes and talk with your doctor about treatment options. Finally, take your medicine. Follow doctor's orders, and if you don't understand something, ask. • The last thing to remember are the signs of a heart attack. They include pain or discomfort in the jaw, neck or back; feeling weak, lightheaded or faint; chest pain or discomfort; pain or discomfort in arms or shoulder; shortness of breath; nausea; and cold sweats.
