Free income tax assistance will be available for Anson County Residents sixty years of age or older of low or moderate income, low income, or the disable needing help in preparing their income tax returns. The assistance is a program sponsored by AARP and Grace Senior Center.

Volunteer counselors trained in cooperation with the Internal Revenue Service will be at Grace Senior Center on Wednesday, March 4 and Wednesday, April 1, from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. each day. This free assistance is designed to help taxpayers fill out forms 1040EZ, 1040A, 1040 and the North Carolina return.

Persons using the service who have Itemized Deductions or Capital Gains need to schedule appointments on either day between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. All using the service should bring a picture ID, this year's tax package, age and earnings statements (forms W-2) received from employers, interest statements from banks (form 1099-INT), a copy of last year's tax return, and any other relevant information concerning income and expenses.

Those using the service for Social Security and have no statement, must bring your social security card. Electronic filing of returns will be available.


BRLC Volunteers Complete Serve Safe Training
