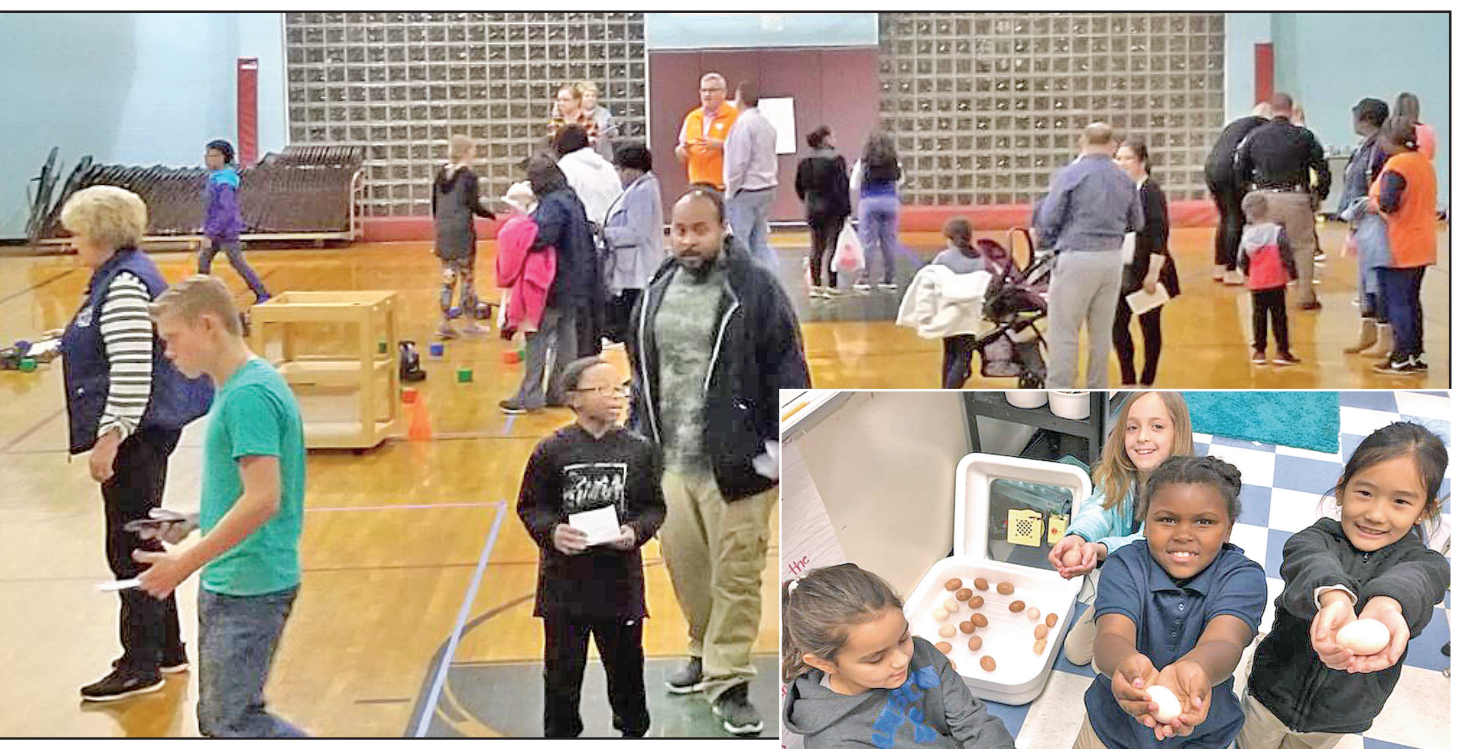
Ansonville Elementary School Kid's Heart Challenge
