All Aboard the Steam Over Spencer: A Live Steam Model Train Event at the N.C. Transportation Museum!

All aboard! Join us for the Steam Over Spencer: A Live Steam Model Train Event on March 6 - 8 from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. Come experience several large operating model train displays featuring scale model locomotives that are powered by live steam!

A large variety of locomotives and railroad cars will be featured during this event. These locomotives produce

their own power from a variety of fuel sources rather than being powered by an electric current through the track, making them different from conventional electric trains. Owners of these fascinating models are expected to come from across the country to share their detailed collections

with other hobbyists and museum visitors. Cost to attend the event is \$6 for adults, \$5 for seniors age 65+ and active military with ID, and \$4 for children ages 3-12. Museum members and children under the age of three are free. The N.C. Transportation Museum's regular exhibits will be open during the event and are included in admission. Train rides aboard the museum's train are also available for an additional price on Saturday and Sunday.

New Video: Prescribed Burning on State Forest Lands: A Two-Part Series.

Forest Supervisor Kevin Pittman walks us through the process of planning and carrying out a type of prescribed burn called a hazard reduction burn and the benefits of using prescribed fire as a tool for managing a forest.

Medicaid is important to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. In North Carolina, Medicaid supports people with I/DD through the Innovations Waiver, 1915(i), and other home and community based services.

The U.S. House is set to vote on a budget resolution that could drastically cut Medicaid funding and impact North Carolina.

Call vour US Representative TODAY to tell them about the importance of Medicaid and how it supports you in your everyday life.

Let them know the impact that cuts to Medicaid will have on your life and your community. Tell them what Medicaid does for you. If you have HCBS (also sometimes called a 'waiver'), tell them how it helps you and what you will lose if that Medicaid service goes away.

Your calls make a difference! Even if your representative has said they support Medicaid or don't want Medicaid cuts to impact people with disabilities, it is still important to call them and share what the impact of Medicaid cuts would be to you.
