#### The Music of John Denver is Coming to the Ansonia

Are you a John Denver fan? Come experience his music the way it was intended - live and in concert when Carolina Town brings "An Evening with John Denver" to the Ansonia stage on Saturday, March 23 at 7:30 p.m. This will be a re-creation of a John Denver concert as it would have been performed in the years shortly before the artist's untimely death in 1997.

Carolina Town consists of area residents Rod Almond on guitar and lead vocals, Dean Martin on guitar and backup vocals, and John Stafford on keyboard and backup vocals. The concert will include more than twenty songs that Denver loved and most often included in his concerts, plus two songs that the artist never had a chance to do in a public performance.

The performance will last two hours, with a fifteen-minute intermission. Tickets for reserved seating are \$10 and are available at the Anson County Arts Council and Lacy's in Wadesboro and online at www.ansoniatheatre.com.

### ...Remembering Ballard's Store

In the year of 1940 Tom Ballard and his family moved to Polkton, opening a "variable" grocery/hardware store. These were days when the economy was seemingly on the upturn! The post office, shirt factory, other stores, saw mills, farmers - all seemed to be "on the move upward!!" So, the Ballard store was looking "upward" too, as many in the Polkton area had needs!

So...groceries, hardware items, some dry goods, and even an inside kerosene tank to "hand pump" a customer some oil if needed!

During the military maneuvers in the 1940's the G.I.s would come in to buy soft drinks, various canned food items, crackers, cookies and cakes. You can imagine...they wanted most anything to eat other than the regular G.I. food! Daily on the go...through the woods, etc. - they would get to the store at about five a.m., pick up the wanted items, and head back to camp!

Sharing, hopefully, a bit of old time history!\*

\*Note: A loaf of bread and many food stuff items were something like 10¢.

#### Free Tax Aid Offered at Grace Senior Center

Free income tax assistance will be available for Anson County Residents sixty years of age or older of low or moderate income needing help in preparing their income tax returns through a program sponsored by AARP and Grace Senior Center. The volunteer counselors are trained in cooperation with the Internal Revenue Service. They will be at Grace Senior Center again on April 9, from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. This free assistance is designed to help taxpayers fill out forms 1040EZ, 1040A, 1040 and the North Carolina return.

Persons using the service should bring this year's tax package, age and earnings statements (forms W-2) received from employers, interest statements from banks (form 1099-INT), a copy of last year's tax return, and any other relevant information concerning income and expenses. Electronic filing of returns will be available.
