Funds raised will be used to support ongoing 4-H youth programs in Anson County. Advance tickets are \$30 per person and can be purchased at the Extension Office located at 501 McLaurin Street in Wadesboro, Lacy's, or from committee members and staff. Ticket price at the door will be \$40.

Back by popular demand is the Dance Competition. Individuals and groups can take their talent to the dance floor to vie for the title of "2015 Clover Crawl Dance Competition Winner." Registration will be available at the ticket table the night of the event.

This fundraiser helps make up dollars lost due to setbacks and cutbacks in funds that have traditionally provided 4-H programming and operating budgets. The money raised from the Clover Crawl will support programs that address the well being of youth, families, and communities in Anson County. 4-H programs annually reach over 1,300 young people in the community. Youth participate in activities and programs such as school enrichment, summer camps, after school programming, community service and other year round educational programs.

Anson 4-H and 4-H Youth Promise also works with adults, volunteer educators and youth to provide community projects, parenting skills and enhanced leadership abilities. All 4-H programming is available to any youth between ages 5-19.
