Carolina Female College/Ansonville Methodist Church

Carolina Female College and Ansonville Methodist Church were established about 1844, with the college originally going into operation in January 1851. Many changes came along about this time - "College, NC" was changed to Ansonville about 1857, and Ansonville Methodist Episcopal Church, South was chartered through the then South Carolina Methodist Conference.

In the years that followed, there was a flu epidemic that severely affected many people. Not only were the students affected, but everyone in the general area also. Many people died, as treatment was not as effective as some of today's "wonder drugs." There are several graves in the Bethlehem Cemetery with names and some words about "searching for an education" and "the epidemic." The college closed sometime later.

I do remember when I was five or six years old, going with Mama to visit some of the had residents who rented apartments in the old building. The brick building was three stories high, with thick, heavy heart pine floors. The wooden shingle roof eventually began leaking so badly that all the residents moved out. The remains of the old "brick skeleton" was torn down in the early 1930's.

The Methodist Church was a very impressive wood structure with four large columns across the front. I was about five years old and went to Sunday School there. Upstairs there was something like balconies down each side of the main part of the sanctuary for classrooms. I always received a Sunday School card every Sunday.

It was on a cold January Sunday that the church burned to the ground.

Very soon after the fire building plans were made and a new brick church was built. It was completed during the Depression years, and was dedicated on April 4, 1937, by Dr. J. B. Craven, Bishop Paul B. Kern and Pastor L. F. Strader.
