

#### **Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders** Workshop Will be Held on March 22

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A Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Workshop will be held at the Anson County Cooperative Extension Center, located at 501 McLaurin Street in Wadesboro, from 12 noon to 2 pm. Amy Hendricks, Coordinator of NC Fetal Alcohol Prevention Program, will be the guest speaker. Lunch and materials will be provided free. What is Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD)? FASD is an umbrella term

describing the range of effects that can occur in an individual prenatally exposed to alcohol. These effects may include physical, mental, behavioral, and/or learning disabilities with lifelong implications. 35% of individuals with an FASD have been in jail or prison at some point. 55% of people with an FASD will be confined to a prison, psychiatric institution, or drug/alcohol treatment center. 95% of people with an FASD also have a mental illness. More information is available at The goal of the presentation is to educate participants about the importance of

preventing alcohol exposed pregnancies and how alcohol impacts the brain during fetal development; and to clearly define Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASDs) and how this disorder presents in an individual across the lifespan. The participants will also identify potential strategies and interventions for working with individuals whohave an FASD, and recognize their role as a provider in preventing alcohol exposed pregnancies and FASDs.



Dear Editor,

I 'm sure you get a lot of requests from people asking you to cover their stories, so please forgive me for piling on, but I'm just a local mom trying to save my baby girl from a terminal disease. I would be eternally grateful for your help.

At just 3 months of age my adorable daughter Sadie was diagnosed with Sanfilippo Syndrome, also known as "Childhood Alzheimer's." It is a cruel disease that takes your child away from you right in front of your eyes. Sadie's 2nd birthday is coming up on Thursday, March 8th, and it will be a bittersweet day because we know she is get-



regressing by age 3. Today Sadie is a smart, happy and healthy toddler. Without treatment her future will be dementia, a wheelchair, a feeding tube, and death in her teens. She needs a cure now, and we are looking for help in getting awareness for this rare disease For Sadie's second birthday, we have two goals: 1) Collect letters, videos, cards, etc. for Sadie's time capsule to be opened on her 18th birthday after she has been cured. We're collecting things from friends and strangers because we want Sadie to know how impactful her life has been. 
Do You Need a Coat or **Blanket?** Would You Like to Donate?
