"Television...in the Beginning"

As I have written before - television was "very young" when it came to North Carolina in 1949. Thinking back on some of those days, having to install outside antennas on high, steep roofs - even on cold, windy days - makes for more appreciation in television technology!

There was no cable service and telephone service had begun to improve and expand. Electric services were changing, many homes had service into a 60 amp switch and were considered "adequately wired"!!

Back to television, did you know that Doug Mayes was the first television anchorman in North Carolina? WBTV

(Channel 3) signed on the air on July 15, 1949, with a test pattern, etc., and it seemed like that was all for a long time. Finally they did come on air with some of the early TV folks, such as Clyde "Cloudy" McLean, Jim Patterson, Arthur Smith, Charles Kuralt, Fred Kirby, Betty Feezer, and Doug, of course!

There continues to be changes in television - I remember our first set - a 12 1/2 inch screen and very heavy (about 150 pounds), and the "snowy picture" would make you cold even in the summertime! Many advances, not only in television, but all electronics, telephones, appliances, etc.

Free Groceries Available to Eligible Families Saturday

Also, free food products are available at BRLC every Wednesday at 9 a.m.

The Burnsville Recreation & Learning Center (BRLC) Emergency Food Pantry will distribute free food products this Saturday, March 18 at 10 a.m. These foods are provided by the NC Department of Agriculture through the Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina. Families will be served until the food runs out - first come, first served.

The US federal income guidelines will be a determining factor for each individual's eligibility and food items will only be available to Ansonians who qualify. Individuals who have not registered before nor received food from the BRLC Emergency Food Pantry must have financial documentation as proof of income to be served. A neighbor who does not have the necessary documentations will not be served. Families that receive food stamp assistance automatically qualify. Each family will only be provided these commodities this month. Parents are asked not to bring small children. Neighbors, please park in parking lot behind center.

BRLC distributes free groceries to eligible families on Wednesdays at 9 a.m. and at other times. You can contact them at 704-826-8182 for information. BRLC is located at 13349 Highway 742 North in Burnsville, across from the Fire Department.

Wadesboro Housing Authority is seeking applications for S8 Manager/HQS Inspector for the S8 Housing Choice Voucher Program. The position is effective March 1, 2017; Close date is March 20, 2017.

Reports to: Executive Director

Position Summary This is a full-time position with benefits.

Duties and Responsibilities: An S8 Manager performs a variety of office activities to implement Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- 1) Strong interpersonal skills.
- 2) Moderate to excellent computer skills.
- 3) Schedule interviews with S8 landlords and tenants, prepare and process correspondence to landlords and tenants. Assures that all assisted housing management records are accurate and correct.
- 4) Possession of a valid State of North Carolina vehicle operator's license, reliable automotive transportation, and a driving record.
- 5) Reviews housing applications to determine family eligibility for housing, performs annual S8 Housing Quality Standards and Housing Inspections, Tenant Recertifications.
- 6) Knowledge of the general operations and procedures of a Public Housing Agency and of local state and federal regulations governing subsidized housing programs is a big plus.

Education and Experience

High School Diploma required. Graduation from a two-four year college or university with a degree in Public or Business Administration or closely related subjects is desirable. Experience in housing management or combination of education and experience.

Housing Quality Standard Certification/Inspection and experience and/or training in the Housing Choice Voucher Program or other HUD housing program are a big plus.
