Anson High School's head varsity softball coach Mr. Terry Ponds had high words of praise for his 2012 team. "These girls are very talented," said Ponds. The team was, at the time of this article, 3-2 and prepping for conference play.

On March 1 Anson went head to head with the Richmond Raiders, and came up one run shy of victory, losing a very close game, 5-4. Pitcher Taylor Bates picked up her first loss. She pitched seven innings with eight strikeouts. Scoring for Anson were Devin Smith, Kailee Cole, Bates and Mallory Gathings. Leading hitters were Bates, 2-4, Gathings, 3-4 and Elizabeth Tarlton, 2-4.

On March 6, Anson took on Cheraw and pounded the Lady Rams in five innings, 16-1, Anson. Taylor Bates returned to the mound and pitched four innings with three strikeouts. Elizabeth Tarlton pitched the final inning. Scoring for the Lady Cats were Devin Smith with two runs, Kailee Cole three runs, Bates two runs, Mallory Gathings three runs, Tarlton one run, Lindsey Haire one run, Kristen Emrich one run, Taylor Pace one run and Jamonica Smith two runs. Leading hitters were Smith 2-4, Cole 3-4, Bates 2-4 and Gathings 3-4.

Their non-conference schedule continued on March 13, with a second showdown with Richmond County and yet another loss to the Raiders. 


students are targeted for this activity as a tool for dropout prevention. This also correlates with planning high school paths and courses. This opportunity exhibits the relevance of
