Anson County's January Unemployment Rate Was 5.3%

Anson County's unemployment rate for January was 5.3%, up slightly from December's 4.9% rate. Statewide the unemployment rate was 4.7% in January.

Anson's total labor force in January was 10,375. Of that number 9,830 were employed and 545 were unemployed. In December the total labor force was 10,312 with 9,802 employed and 510 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) increased in 93 of North Carolina's counties in January, decreased in one, and remained unchanged in six. Hyde County had the highest unemployment rate at 14.6 percent, while Buncombe County had the lowest at 3.6 percent.

Fourteen of the state's metro areas experienced rate increases while one remained unchanged. Among the metro areas, Rocky Mount at 6.9 percent had the highest rate and Asheville had the lowest rate at 3.7 percent.

When compared to the same month last year, not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased in all 100 counties. All 15 metro areas experienced rate decreases

The number of workers employed statewide (not seasonally adjusted) decreased in January by 7,551 to 4,705,785, while those unemployed increased 16,597 to 230,510. Since January 2017, the number of workers employed statewide increased 97,857, while those unemployed decreased 23,674.
